<b>Graduate profile</b>	<p>The graduate of the 2nd degree of the Economic Diplomacy study program has extensive knowledge of the world economy, international politics and international law. He communicates in three foreign languages at a professional level. The portfolio of professional courses is supplemented by specialized elective courses taught in a foreign language, enabling a narrower professional specialization of the graduate in a specific area. During the study, he/she will gain knowledge from other specific areas related to the study program Economic Diplomacy.</p> <p>Graduates of the second degree of study in the study program Economic Diplomacy can apply the acquired theoretical knowledge in solving specific problems in practice; they have deep knowledge of individual areas of the study program. Based on this knowledge, they are qualified to analyze particular issues of economic diplomacy and apply innovative approaches in international economic relations and critically evaluate the broader context of development trends in the world economy and the involvement and operation of the Slovak Republic in global economic and political processes.</p>

- to prepare the graduate for positions in central state administration bodies, permanent representations, embassies, European institutions, in their respective branches and departments focused on the development of international economic relations,

<b>Evaluation of the study programme graduates employability</b>	<p>According to the portal profesia.sk, the graduates of Economic Diplomacy study program belong to one of the most successful graduates from all faculties of Slovak universities in 2020. In 2018 the Faculty of International Relations (FIR) was ranked third among all the faculties of Slovak universities regarding the demand for graduates on the labor market. In 2019 FIR was ranked fourth and in 2020 ninth keeping its stabile position in top ten. Almost the half of graduates in 2019 (45%) worked after graduation in their field of study (according to the website: uplatnenie.sk).</p> <p>According to the data portal uplatnenie.sk the FIR graduates mostly took job positions in public administration and defense, professional scientific and technical activities, and administrative and supportive services. They also worked as specialists and analysts in the field of finance, specialists in the fields of accountancy and financial control, in the fields of strategy and development, analysts in the fields of management and organization of work as well as professional workers in public administration.</p> <p>According to data collected from the survey, after their graduation the graduates of Economic Diplomacy study program start working as project managers in state administration (especially EU funds); experts of international relations, foreign business and investments; specialists of bodies of central state administration, embassies, institutions of the EU or as assistants and auditors in audit companies.</p>

<b>Evaluation of the study programme quality by employers (feedback)</b>	Employers evaluate the graduates of Economic Diplomacy study program very positively regarding their theoretical knowledge and preparedness as well as their knowledge in the given field. Their presentation and communication abilities are also highly evaluated, especially the level of foreign languages. According to the employers the graduates approach to solve problems and tasks is active, they are creative and they are endowed with analytical thinking. The connection of theoretical knowledge gained during the study and practical implementation in practice is perceived as very well mastered. Except of the excellent knowledge from the fields of economy and international relations, their analytical and language skills, the graduates also demonstrate ambitions and diplomatic skills. The employers would welcome, if the students are given more space for improvement of their IT skills within the study program. Some of the employers think that the graduates' IT skills are poorer in a comparison with their other skills and knowledge, Despite of this fact the IT skills are considered above-average in the general evaluation. They would also welcome, if the graduates have more work experiences or practice, what they could get during their study. They suggest the students to participate in practice at Ministries or State Public Administration Bodies more intensively. Some employers pointed out that they would appreciate the graduates' specialization in specific fields, such as broader knowledge in the field of the European Union law.

<p><b>Results of student feedback and related measures to improve the study programme quality</b></p>	<p>Based on the results of students' survey the following measures were taken in connection with the lecturers, which could help to continue to increase the knowledge and development of skills at the Faculty:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ More tests during the semester to gain more systematic preparedness and improvement to learn new course matters,</li> <li>✓ Stimulation of students' ability of critical thinking via discussions on current economic, political and legal topics.</li> <li>✓ Appropriate combination of lectures and seminars of courses with respect to their form and content,</li> <li>✓ Dealing with actual topics, to keep the content of syllabi and their innovation within the meaning of current trends,</li> <li>✓ Adjusting the content of exams to the topics lectured during the semester.</li> </ul> <p>We did an adequate arrangement of students' work load regarding the teaching of foreign languages. We responded to the demand of students regarding the teaching of third foreign language, what we incorporate into the study program of Master degree and, at the same time, we added more hours weekly to this course. Thanks to this change of intensifying education of the third foreign language, students are able to reach Language Level A2 after four semesters. Besides we also responded to the necessity of professional specialization of students and added two optional courses in the second and third semester. We also took into consideration another students' demand. Students experienced in their study program a lack of development of soft skills, communication skills, negotiation techniques or organization skills. Therefore we doubled the hour load for the course "Negotiations in Diplomatic Practice", thanks to it the students during the last year of their study devote themselves to the preparation of a Model Conference. The education goals of this course focus on the development of above mentioned skills. All of this help us to create more space for broader involvement of experts from practice into the education process. The other courses of this study program as well as various</p>



	<p>option for study abroad and internships bring students opportunities to gain new contacts and experiences. To make it simpler, the students are allowed to be released (a request is needed) from the study and additionally their internship is accepted as an optional course.</p>
<p><b>Results of graduate feedback and related measures to improve the study programme quality.</b></p>	<p>Based on the written graduate feedback via standardized surveys we present some examples of specific initiatives and measures the Faculty responded to these initiatives.</p> <p>Initiative: The teachers of the study program should put more stress on the development of communication skills and self-confident presentation.</p> <p>Measure: Changes were implemented in several Master courses. There were added presentations on selected professional topics to help students to learn rhetoric skills and to able to discuss on selective topics, to form arguments (measures were implemented for example regarding the courses of “International public law 2” or “International economic law”).</p> <p>Initiative: To lead the students to more systematic, logic and independent work with information at solving practical tasks. To focus more on the current topics and international law, to improve critical thinking of students, more discussions and argumentation, to organize the seminars as scientific colloquium.</p> <p>Measure: In several courses of study program, the teachers do not require of students to present only theoretical skills and encyclopedic information, but they put stress on the creative approach to the discussed issues, development of analytical and critical thinking, argumentation techniques etc. We can present as an example a course “International public law 2”, where the students are divided into teams and within the assigned tasks they try to collect relevant and verified information connected with current armed situations and conflicts in the world. Afterwards they try to present them to their colleagues in the class, but they have to take into consideration not only the legal specifics of situations, but also their political and economic connections and, at the same time, they have to remain legally correct with their arguments. The final evaluation of the course is realized as a colloquium, where each team present the results of their semester work, which is followed by a mutual confrontation of the most important results by all teams.</p> <p>Initiative: The management could facilitate and help more with internships and work.</p> <p>Measure: Currently the management of FIR supports to a large extent and organizes selection procedure for</p>

	internships at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as well as the Representation of the European Union. The students have options to have internships at another central bodies of state administration or embassies of the Slovak Republic in abroad thanks to Erasmus+ Internships. The students have usually their internships during the semester and they are almost automatically (based on a request) released from the study and additionally their internship is accepted as an optional course.
