Required abilities and necessary admission requirements	The basic condition for admission to second-degree study is completed first-degree study. Qualitative selection of applicants for study programmes in the Slovak language will be made on the basis of theirstudy results at the bachelor's degree, while the criterion for admission is a weighted arithmetic average for the entire period of bachelor's study except the last (summer) semester of study. The applicant for study in English must successfully pass the entrance exam from the general study prerequisites in English in the form of a test. At the same time, the materials submitted by the applicant together with the application for study (e.g. 2 recommendations from experts who are well acquainted with the personal and professional profile of the applicant or experts from practice) and a motivation letter in English are comprehensively assessed. The Admissions Committee will draw up a qualitative order of candidates on the basis of the assessment of the submitted documents.
Admission procedures	Applicants apply electronically exclusively through the EUBA Academic Information System. The admission committee of the faculty decides on admission to study in accordance with the conditions specified in the valid principles of the admission procedure for the 2nd degree study.
